

### The Question Is? Allergies Or Pink Eye

Conjunctivitis also known as pink eye is the most common eye infection found in a child. It can cause redness; itching; inflammation or swelling; and a clear or white, yellow, or greenish goey liquid to collect in the eyes. Kids get conjunctivitis for different reasons.



Most kids get it from bacteria or viruses. This form of conjunctivitis is contagious and should be treated by a pediatrician immediately.



Children can also get conjunctivitis because of **allergies** or because they get something irritating in their eyes, this form of conjunctivitis is **not contagious**

to others but still should be treated to prevent further complications. However, the best prevent for any infection or allergy is to wash your hands as much as possible.
